The program starts with the work of Berlin based artist Astrid Nippoldt *Fog on Nov 2* which shows images of Mount St.Helens appearing suddenly from grey mist like a mirage. The photographs were downloaded from a web camera, mainly at sunrise or sunset, edited and then filmed on 16mm.
